Re: Automatic License Plate Readers and Sanctuary Contracting Ordinance

Dear Mayor Butt and Council Members,

The purpose of this letter is to help inform your decision regarding whether or not to extend a new contract to Vigilant Solutions for automatic license plate reader storage from 2019-2022 and in so doing to execute a waiver to the May 2018 Sanctuary City Contracting Ordinance passed by the Richmond City Council.

Oakland Privacy is a citizen's coalition that works regionally to defend the right to privacy and enhance public transparency and oversight regarding the use of surveillance techniques and equipment. We worked with the 2018 Richmond City Council to pass the nation's first Sanctuary Contracting Ordinance under the sponsorship of then-council members Jovanka Beckles and Ada Recinos.

I want to begin with an apology. After advocating with the 2018 council, I regret that Oakland Privacy did not begin an extensive dialogue with the City about the available alternatives in advance of the June 2019 expiration of your current agreement. The Richmond City Council passed the Sanctuary Contracting Ordinance resoundingly in order to prevent the transfer of city-collected data to federal immigration authorities and to keep municipal dollars from feeding the Trump deportation machine. We are very proud that Richmond, California was the first adopter of this sanctuary contracting ordinance. We share your goals, and we should have offered you technical assistance in executing them well in advance of the expiration of your current contract.

This letter will attempt to address several issues brought up in your board discussion on June 18 including the full spectrum of license plate reader options, the Freeway Security Project, the nature of Vigilant Solution's business model, the current information sharing practices of the City of Richmond with regard to license plate reader data, and where the City can go from here. We hope it will be helpful.

To begin with, here is a non-comprehensive list of some Bay Area police departments that do not use Vigilant Solutions.

Alameda County Sheriff's Department, Atherton Police Department, Benicia Police Department, Brisbane Police Department, Central Marin Police Authority, Ceres Police Department, Daly City Police Department, Dixon Police Department, Fremont Police Department, HIDTA, Hillsborough Police Department, Menlo Park Police Department, Modesto Police Department, Newark Police Department, Oakland Police Department, Piedmont Police Department, Rio Vista Police Department, San Bruno Police Department, San Francisco Police Department, San Leandro Police Department, San Mateo Police Department, SFO Airport Police, Shasta County Sheriff's Department, Solano County Sheriff, South San Francisco Police Department, Vallejo Police Department.

It is important to differentiate between the manufacturer of the license plate scanner equipment and the provider of storage and sharing functionality. Richmond is currently using both Vigilant Solutions equipment and the Vigilant Solutions storage and sharing database, which is called [LEARN](#). LEARN houses a law enforcement license plate reader database called the National Vehicle Locator System (NVLS) as well as commercial license plate reader databases which contain scans collected by numerous private entities including repo companies, bounty hunters, homeowners associations and private security firms.

There are several other manufacturers of license plate reader equipment including [Genetec](#), [Leonardo](#), [Perceptics](#) and 3M/PIPs which is now called [Neology](#).

The primary competitor to Vigilant's LEARN-NVLS database for license plate reader sharing between law enforcement agencies is not another private company, but the Northern California Regional Intelligence Center or NCRIC. From its headquarters at the San Francisco Federal Building, NCRIC operates a license plate reader storage and sharing platform that collected [72.9 million license plate scans](#) from Bay Area law enforcement agencies in the last 9 months (August 2018 to May of 2019). According to NCRIC director Mike Sena, the NCRIC ALPR database [became compliant with the California Values Act in 2018](#) and no longer makes data available for the purpose of immigration enforcement.

It was concerning to hear Richmond's police chief inform the council that there was no alternative platform for local license plate reader data to be shared between law enforcement agencies besides Vigilant's LEARN-NVLS database. While there are also concerns about using NCRIC, (in short, license plate readers are problematic technology), it is factually untrue that there is no platform for law enforcement agencies to share plate scans other than Vigilant's LEARN-NVLS. As examples, the cities of Fremont, Vallejo and Piedmont, and the proposed BART ALPR systems, all [send](#) or propose to send their data to NCRIC. Richmond is aware of NCRIC since the City of Richmond signed an information-sharing agreement with NCRIC that was noted in a June 2017 list of NCRIC's information-sharing partners. (See Appendix A).

Police Chief Brown stated to the Council that the Richmond Police Department picks and chooses local law enforcement agencies to share real-time location data of the vehicles of Richmond residents and visitors via Vigilant's LEARN-NVLS database. In Appendix B, you will find a sharing report from the Richmond Police Department's LEARN-NVLS account printed out by City staff in response to a public records request from the Electronic Frontier Foundation in February of 2018. The report contains a list of all of the law enforcement agencies that the Richmond Police Department has picked and chosen to share the City's data with.

On the second page of that report, you will find an agency called "San Diego Sector of Customs and Border Patrol" which is commonly abbreviated as CDP. The Border Patrol, while a sister agency to Immigrations and Customs Enforcement within the Department of Homeland Security, performs immigration enforcement and was specifically the agency executing the Trump family separation policy in 2018 that has been [condemned by the United Nations](#).

On page 6 of the report, you will see a short list of the hotlists being received by the Richmond Police Department via LEARN-NVLS. One of the entries is "HSI-Master". "HSI" stands for Homeland Security Investigations, which is [a division of ICE](#).

The sharing report lists 167 law enforcement agencies who have access to real-time geolocation data of vehicles in the City of Richmond. Of that list, more than 60 are not only "not local", but are not contained within the State of California.

Some examples of law enforcement agencies that had access to Richmond's license plate reader data in 2018.

Fort Bend County Sheriff (TX)
Fort Lauderdale Police Department (FL)
Gulfport Police Department (MS)
Grantville Police Department (GA)
Hickory Hills Police Department (IL)
Hiram Police Department (GA or OH – we can't tell which)

We'll stop there, but the pattern continues through the complete list which can be seen in Appendix B and was also sent to the Richmond City Council under separate cover on June 3. It is improbable that the Richmond Police Department specifically and deliberately picked and chose each of these agencies to receive Richmond CA's license plate reader data, and if so, why? Why Binghamton and not Buffalo? Why Cedar Rapids and not Iowa City? More likely, the recipient agencies are the result of defaults set by Vigilant and no law enforcement agency uploading data to the Vigilant system has any real idea what agencies can access their data.

The alternative interpretation of this sharing report is that Richmond's police chief, in a sanctuary jurisdiction, after the implementation date of the California Values Act, specifically chose to share the vehicle locations of all Richmond residents and employees and visitors with the Border Patrol, an agency that engages in civil immigration enforcement.

Why does it matter how this chaotic and sloppy private Vigilant ALPR database operates? Because ICE is inside the LEARN-NVLS database, every single day. Records in the possession of the ACLU [confirm](#) that 9,000 ICE agents have access to Vigilant's LEARN database and they perform 30,000 searches every month or more than 1,000 per day. These searches are for the purpose of hunting immigrants. ACLU [reviewed log entries](#) and found justifications entered by ICE agents using the following language:

"ADMINISTRATIVE VISA OVERSTAY" - February 23, 2018

"ADMINISTRATIVE DACA DENIED" - April 29, 2019

"ADMINISTRATIVE POSSIBLE ILLEGAL ALIEN LIVING IN IMPERIAL VALLEY WITHOUT LEGAL DOCUMENTS" – June 7, 2018

"CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION OF OWNER'S SON FOR REMOVAL PURPOSES" – May 30, 2018

"INVESTIGATIONS VEHICLE OF FAMILY MEMBER OF VISA OVERSTAY SUBJECT" – June 11, 2018

"INVESTIGATIONS SEARCHING FOR PARENT OF POSSIBLE USC [US CITIZEN] CLAIM" – August 6, 2018

"INVESTIGATIONS ATTEMPTING TO LOCATE TRAVEL PATTERNS AND MOST LIKELY LOCATIONS OF INTEREST WHERE TO LOCATE SUBJECT" – February 12, 2018

"ADMINISTRATIVE TO SEE WHEN SUBJECT DEPARTS AND RETURNS TO RESIDENCE" – February 8, 2018

"INVESTIGATIONS RUNNING PLATE TO DETERMINE BUSINESS LOCATIONS WHERE OWNER IS GOING TO" – March 27, 2018

"INVESTIGATIONS PATTERN OF LIFE" – June 18, 2018

It is not controversial that ICE uses and continues to use Vigilant's privately-owned database to hunt undocumented immigrants. Prior to the current level of outrage against Trump Administration immigration policies, Vigilant president and founder Shawn Smith openly acknowledged it in the press, [as you can see from this article dating from 2012](#) when then-state senator Joe Simitian attempted to regulate Vigilant Solutions.

*Shawn Smith said police in California alone have conducted some 80,000 queries of the service with 35,000 positive auto identifications. **The examples are endless, Smith said. Immigration agents have used the National Vehicle Location Service to track down illegal immigrants.***

Finally, we wanted to provide some supplementary information on the Highway 80 Freeway Security Project. A copy of the 2017 Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Richmond and the Contra Costa District Attorney can found in Appendix C.

The MOU contains no reference to Vigilant Solutions and the MOU does not require Richmond to use any particular vendor. The agreement in effect until 2020 obligates the parties to complete the necessary permit encroachment applications, provide electrical power and research funding sources.

It is not appropriate for the Council to waive existing municipal law based on incorrect assertions. When Richmond's police chief says that continuing to do business with Vigilant Solutions is not hurting people in Richmond's immigrant community, that the City was not sending real time location data to immigration enforcement agencies, that there are restrictions on where the data ends up that RPD can and is controlling, and that there is no other platform besides Vigilant's that interconnects local law enforcement, these statements are not accurate.

We ask the Richmond City Council to implement the Sanctuary Contracting ordinance and move away from the privately owned and poorly regulated Vigilant system into a more disciplined platform for license plate reader storage and sharing.

The reasons to do this are two-fold; firstly to ensure municipal data is not being used for civil immigration enforcement and secondly to stop using taxpayer funds to subsidize the private information flow enabling the Trump deportation machine.

Our recommendations are as follows:

1. Richmond should terminate its contract with Vigilant Solutions as soon as practically possible. Any contract extension should be signed for the minimal amount of time necessary to effect a transition and be accompanied by a Council resolution indicating that the change in vendor is to occur as soon as possible.
2. If Richmond wishes to retain license plate information sharing capacity by way of NCRIC that the City move to a brief retention period. The Bay Area Rapid Transit District is proposing a 30-day retention period and State Assemblyman Ed Chau, the chair of the Ca Assembly Privacy and Consumer Protection Committee, has a bill in the Legislature proposing a statewide retention limit on all license plate reader data collected by public agencies of 60 days, after which the data would be purged if not retained as evidence in a criminal proceeding. ([Assembly Bill 1782](#)). The Legislature will also be entertaining an audit request for the Joint Legislative Audit Committee from Senator Scott Weiner to audit public agency policies and data retention and sharing practices for automated license plate readers.
3. The City should implement an audit function so that the efficacy of the license plate reader system in fighting crime is explicit. The Council should be informed of the number of plate scans collected annually, the number actually used for investigative purposes (usually this is about 2/10 of a percent on average) and the amount that formally becomes evidence in a criminal investigation. Data is necessary to evaluate if the expense and intrusiveness of the program are justified by the crime-fighting results.

Thank you for Richmond's leadership in aligning municipal contracting with municipal values. Please let us know if we can provide any additional or supplementary material.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

FREEWAY SECURITY NETWORK

The parties to this agreement are the **California Highway Patrol (CHP)**, the **California Department of Transportation (Caltrans)**, the **Contra Costa County District Attorney's Office**, and the **Local Law Enforcement Agencies** adjacent to Freeway Security Network.

The goal of this agreement is to address freeway shootings on Highway 80 from Richmond to Hercules and on State Route 4 from Pittsburg to Antioch by installing the regional **Freeway Security Network, a three year pilot project**. The **Freeway Security Network** will provide law enforcement with real-time access to investigative leads in the freeway shootings through the deployment of **cameras, license plate readers, Shotspotter** technology, a wireless backbone, and associated system hardware with the goal of reducing the level of gun violence on Contra Costa County freeways.

To attain this goal, the parties agree:

1. The State will provide funding for the Freeway Security Network three year pilot project including installation and system operation as further defined in a cooperative agreement;
2. Local Law Enforcement Agencies will own the system, work collaboratively with the City of Pittsburg Public Works Department to provide the electrical power required for the Freeway Security Network and complete any Encroachment Permit Applications required for the Freeway Security Network;
3. Caltrans will work with the system installers and the City of Pittsburg Public Works Department to obtain the required encroachment permits and will review the engineering involved in the installation of the system on the freeways;


4. The State agrees to fund the annual subscription and remote maintenance costs as set forth in the project proposal by Odin System and Shot Spotter for three years. Local Law Enforcement Agencies, CHP and the District Attorney's Office will assume responsibility for ensuring that the Freeway Security Network is properly maintained during this three year period;
5. All parties to this agreement will research and apply for local, state and federal funding for the subscription and remote maintenance costs of the Freeway Security Network to supplant the State's commitment to fund the system for year two and three of the pilot;
6. Upon installation, the Pittsburg Police Department agrees to operate and manage the Freeway Security Network through its Command Center for the duration of the three year Pilot Project and will work with Local Law Enforcement Agencies, the CHP and other government officials as appropriate to provide information regarding criminal investigations;
7. The California Highway Patrol, in collaboration with the Contra Costa County District Attorney's Office, Caltrans and the Local Law Enforcement Agencies, will take the lead in preparing and submit a fiscal year report to the California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA) which details the productivity of the Freeway Security Network in the investigation of freeway shootings, the recovery of felony vehicles, in Amber Alerts, in outside assists in criminal investigations and all other relevant data.
8. This agreement shall remain in effect for three years and may be amended or extended by further written agreement of the parties.
